Interested young people between the ages of 18 and 35 are invited to submit a letter of motivation including:

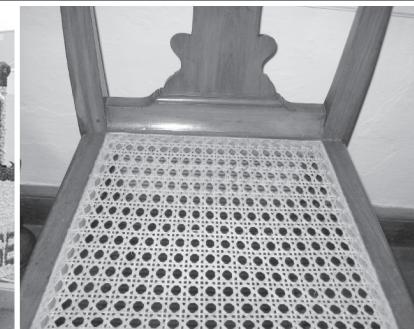
- Age
